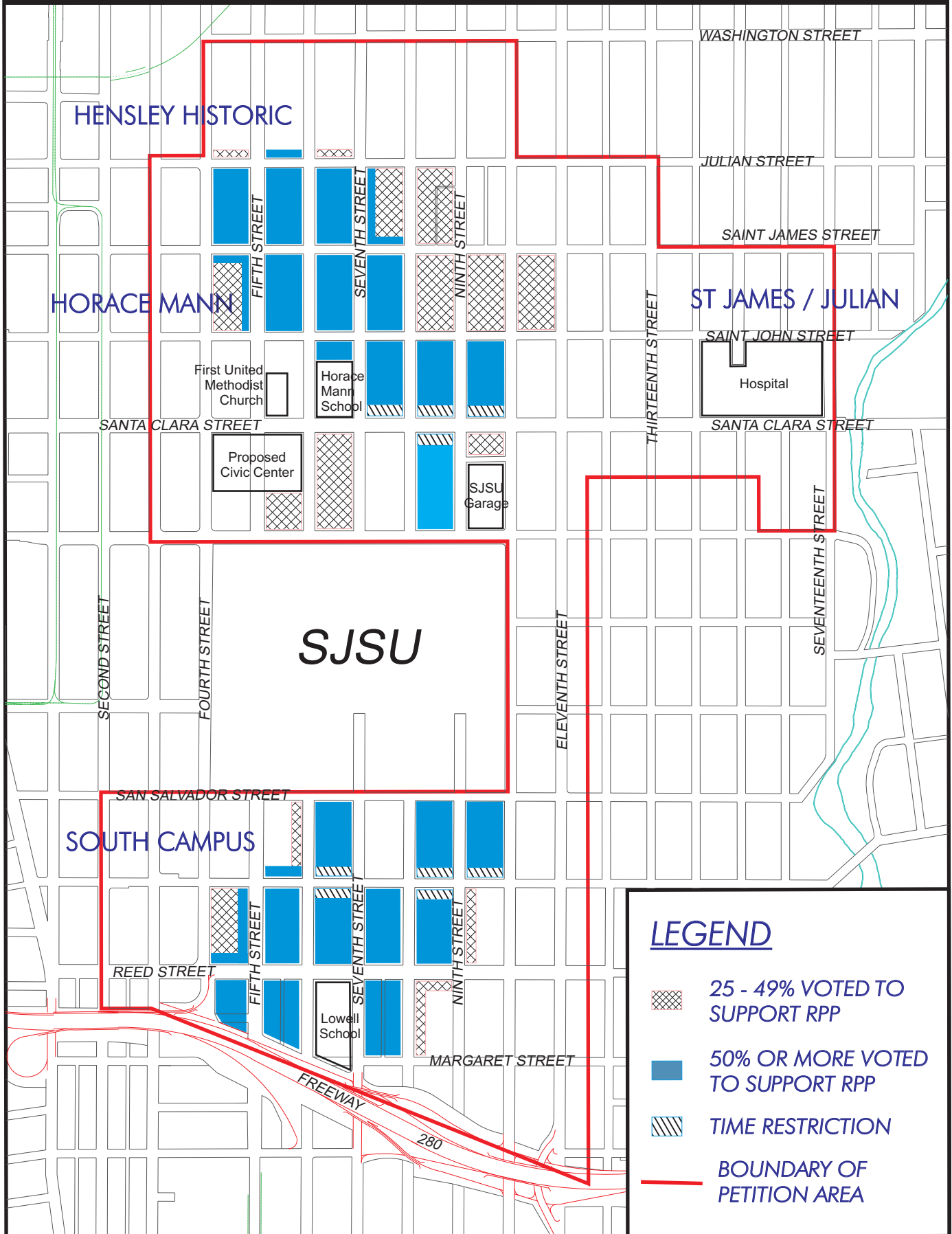


CIVIC PLAZA - PROPOSED RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONES

Your block has voted to support Residential Permit Parking (RPP)

- * *Currently 21 blocks in your neighborhood have supported the implementation of Residential Permit Parking (see map on back)*
- * *Once Residential Permit Parking (RPP) is implemented, people from outside the RPP zone will not be able to park on the streets during specified days and times. More on-street parking spaces should be available for neighborhood residents, guests, business owners/employees and community groups.*
- * *The City of San Jose's Department of Transportation will hold a 2-session meeting for businesses, community organizations and residents in the proposed RPP zones to explain how the program would work in your neighborhood and answer any questions or concerns you may have.*

Some Fast Facts About RPP

- **Types of Parking Permits and their Cost:** Each household in the Permit Parking Zone will be allowed to purchase two **Residential Permits** and one **Guest Permit**. Each permit will cost \$18.50 a year (cost to process by City). Any household can purchase up to two additional **Permits** at a premium price of \$100 each per year (pro-rated by quarter). **Employee** and **Special Use Permits** are available at \$18.50 for businesses and people who have special needs to use street parking in the zone.
- **Hours of Enforcement:** Permit parking will be enforced **Monday through Friday from 8am to 6pm** in the Horace Mann zone and **Monday through Saturday from 8am to 8pm** in the South University Neighborhood zone.
- **Level of Support Needed:** If a simple majority (50% + 1) of the people living and working in your neighborhood (minimum of 150 dwelling units) sign the petition, permit parking will be considered for that area. The San Jose City Council will make the final decision to approve or reject permit parking at a Council meeting in March 2002.
- **Implementation:** If approved by City Council, RPP is anticipated to be implemented in August 2002.
